

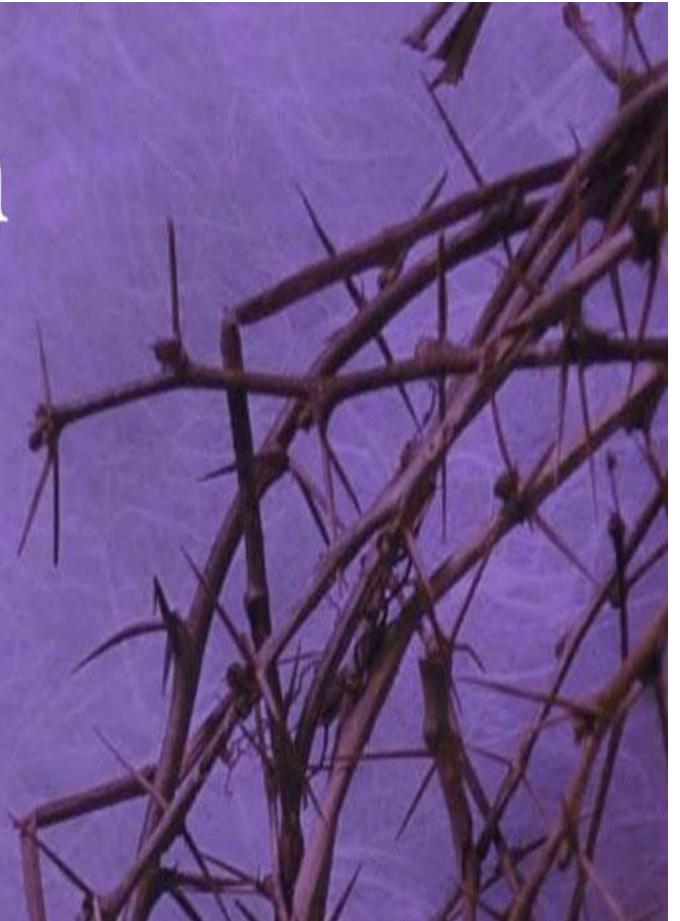

PEM Migrant Education Program

The goal of the summer Migrant Education Program is to help bridge the education gap that our migrant students face when they move between here and Texas throughout the school year. The program provides additional learning opportunities for students K-12 to ensure they are not penalized for their unique learning situation. Services provided include a combination of classroom instruction (math, reading, writing, and other key academic skills) and hands-on activities, such as arts and crafts projects as well as trips to our local state parks. Students are always in need of school supplies and other essentials the program provides.

Last week, the Community Theatre gave us a presentation of a new stage for the front of our sanctuary. We will use this space in the bulletin and newsletter to post questions and answers regarding this proposal for our sanctuary. The proposal was for a permanent stage built in the front of our sanctuary, at a height of 18 inches above the current floor. This will allow everyone in the audience to see clearly what is going on at the stage.

This is the first concern regarding the theatre proposal: It needs to be pointed out that permanently adding to the height of the altar does not actually add any useable performance space, since there won't be any additional stage width or length. Using the current altar has not in the past (nor will it in the future) prohibited use by the community (school choirs, etc.).
