

Mission of the Month for December: Supportive Living Solutions

Supportive Living Solutions has multiple tiers of support for those experiencing homelessness, mental illness, or other disabilities.

The Housing First Solution provides supportive, apartment-based housing for adults experiencing long term homelessness, mental illness, chemical dependency or other disability. Services include housing, job search and resume building, appointments and medical information management, education budgeting and life skills development, resources for chemical dependence recovery, and monthly tenant meeting events.

The Recovery Advantage provides housing for men living with chemical dependency or substance use disorder, who are seeking a life of sobriety. This program is designed to ease the transition from in-patient treatment and allows more time to focus on recovery.

They also offer In-Home-Solution programs for individuals with a focus on increasing independence, achieving personal goals, securing and maintaining housing, and reducing the need for crisis intervention.

Lastly, they provide a 24-hour community based Customized Living housing and services for adults living with a serious and persistent mental illness, or other disability. Individuals maintain independence while also being a part of the larger community.

AL-ANON IS:

A fellowship of relatives and friends of alcoholics who believe their lives have been affected by someone else's drinking. Al-Anon is: a mutual support recovery program based on the Twelve Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous. Al-Anon is: a nonprofessional fellowship is where members share their experience, strength, and hope to solve their common problems. Al-Anon meets weekly at the Plainview Church of Christ on Tuesday evenings from 6:30-7:30 p.m. 205 First Street NE (enter door #3 on 2nd Avenue).
