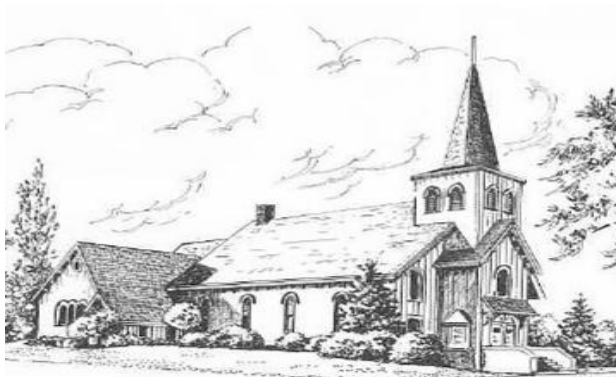

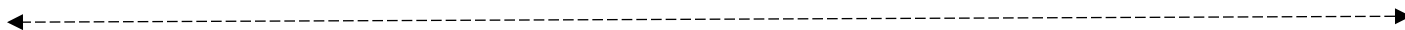

prayer at either or both of these times. There is great power in prayer, and praying together brings unity.

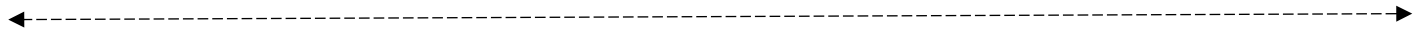
